

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 15

The City Council for the City of Young hereby enacts as follows:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Emergency Services Act".

SECTION 2. PURPOSE AND ESTABLISHMENT.

To respond to any major disaster or state of emergency, the City of Young recognizes the critical need for coordinated emergency management. The City hereby authorizes and establishes an Office of Emergency Services to provide critical emergency support and protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the population residing within the corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 3. STAFFING AND SUPPORT SERVICES.

The City Council directs the allocation of appropriate resources to ensure the Office of Emergency Services shall be staffed twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week (24/7). The office shall provide emergency support to our fire and police departments, specifically managing emergency communication and mutual aid requests.

SECTION 4. EVACUATION COORDINATION.

The Office of Emergency Services shall develop, verify, and ensure that all evacuation plans are accurate for our city and that we are able to properly evacuate. Furthermore, the office shall work in continuous coordination with the county and state to help facilitate safe and orderly mass evacuations as well.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect and commence immediately upon passage.

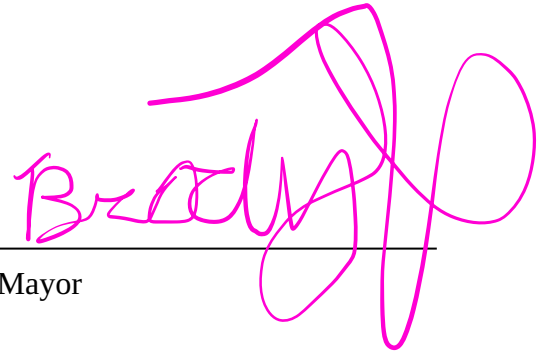
