

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 24

The City Council for the City of Young hereby enacts as follows:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Emergency Flood Response, Deployment, and Reserve Fund Activation Ordinance."

SECTION 2. FINDINGS AND DECLARATION OF URGENCY.

The City Council finds and declares that a local emergency exists due to severe and unanticipated flooding that occurred on the night of Wednesday, June 24, 2026. This natural disaster has created an immediate threat to the public peace, health, and safety of the citizens and infrastructure of the City of Young. In order to mitigate this threat, preserve public safety, and ensure the continuous operation of essential life-saving services, it is critically necessary that this ordinance take effect immediately.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION AND ACTIVATION OF EMERGENCY RESERVE FUND.

The City Council hereby authorizes and directs the immediate activation of the municipal emergency reserve fund. These funds are appropriated to finance the overtime deployment of all City fire officials, all City police officials, and to sustain the operations of the previously established municipal Emergency Operations Center (EOC). The City of Young is currently awaiting supplementary state funding; however, local reserve funds shall be utilized in the interim to ensure no interruption in emergency services.

SECTION 4. FIRE DEPARTMENT DIRECTIVES.

The Fire Chief is hereby directed to immediately deploy all fire department officials to prioritize and respond to any active fires within the municipal limits. Following the suppression of active fires, the secondary priority for all fire department personnel shall be immediate response to any medical emergencies arising from the disaster.

SECTION 5. POLICE DEPARTMENT DIRECTIVES.

The Chief of Police is hereby directed to deploy police officials primarily for scene control at critical infrastructure points and disaster sites, as well as maintaining continuous proactive patrol of affected neighborhoods to preserve the peace, secure property, and assist with public safety operations.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

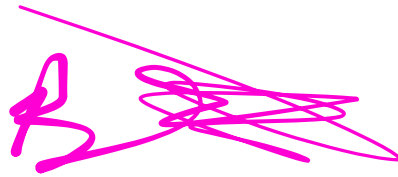
Pursuant to the laws governing general law cities and emergency legislation, this ordinance is required for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety. Upon passage by a required minimum four-fifths (4/5) affirmative vote of the City Council, this ordinance shall take effect and commence immediately.
