

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 22

The City Council for the City of Young hereby enacts as follows:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Supreme Court Restricted Event Public Safety Emergency Ordinance."

SECTION 2. FINDINGS OF EMERGENCY AND URGENCY.

The City Council finds that the high-profile Supreme Court case occurring on June 24, 2026, has drawn extraordinary crowds, posing an immediate threat to public peace, health, and safety due to facility capacity limitations and severe security risks. Therefore, this ordinance is enacted as an emergency measure to preserve public order and safety, to take effect immediately upon passage.

SECTION 3. RESTRICTION AND REMOVAL.

To ensure safety and manage crowd density within municipal facilities, all citizens who are not registered residents of the City of Young attempting to view a specifically designated restricted municipal event must vacate the specified city property by 10:00 PM on the night of June 24, 2026. Any non-resident remaining on the restricted premises past 10:00 PM without authorization may be ordered to leave and removed from the property by authorized law enforcement.

SECTION 4. ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES.

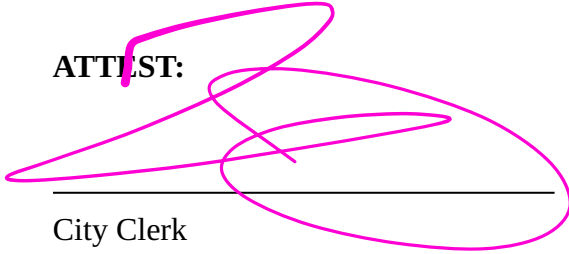
Violation of this ordinance constitutes an infraction. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be assessed a fine of \$50.00. Should a defendant assert an inability to pay, the Court must conduct a financial assessment; if found unable to pay, the defendant shall be assigned to public service determined at the discretion of the City Council or its appointee.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance is an urgency measure and shall take effect and commence immediately upon its passage by a four-fifths (4/5) vote of the City Council.
